Summer Camp

With your support, this past June, Camp Rainbow volunteers welcomed our hematology and oncology summer campers to Babler Outdoor Education Center for a week of "Camp Adventures!"

The week began on Sunday as sixty-nine campers arrived on campus and were presented with their passport and ticket. For the rest of the week, our campers were given the opportunity to "Seek Adventure" by participating in both traditional camp activities and incredible, unique Camp Rainbow adventures. Campers were given the opportunity to explore, create, and participate in programming that took them across the globe from Antarctica to Australia before heading south of the border and back to the USA! When asked to describe his week, our camper said, "Thank you for the friendship, love, and fun!"

Overnight Summer campers are children ages 6-13 years old dealing with a blood disorder or pediatric cancer diagnosis. We are grateful to the many donors and volunteers that help to create the adventures at Camp Rainbow Overnight Oncology Camp.



Day Camp

For one week this past June, our youngest campers could be heard singing the Day Camp chant around Babler Outdoor Education.

Camp Rainbow Day Campers are children 4-6 years old dealing with a cancer diagnosis or blood-disorder. Together with their counselors, our littlest campers enjoyed many of the traditional camp activities as our overnight campers with lots of special extras! Some of their favorite activities included animal yoga, story time with Ariel, and the messy day fun.

SIBs Camp

Sydney sent this note to us just before SIBS Camp 2019. She and her siblings boarded the bus for an adventure filled week in June created for the sixty-eight Super Important Brothers and Sisters of our oncology campers. This overnight camp for children ages 7 to 17 years old who have had or are currently dealing with a sibling's diagnosis of cancer or other blood-related disorders is held at Camp Manitowa Cedar Point. SIBS campers are treated to traditional camp activities, lots of time in the lake boating and swimming, as well as unique and fun Camp Rainbow adventures.

SIBS Camp, like our other camps, if free for the family as a result of the generous support of donors.



Teen Camp

Teen Camp was held over a weekend in March. Our teen campers ages 14-18 years old enjoyed traditional camp activities as well as teen specific programming which included a game truck, an escape room, and paint your own painting activity. During the weekend, our teens partnered with Love Your Melon to create gift bags for other children currently being treated in one of the area hospitals.

Teen-N-Twenty

The Teen-n-Twenty program at Camp Rainbow was created to provide social opportunities for our teen campers to remain connected throughout the year. Half and full day social events are held each quarter for teens ages 14-20 years old. In 2019, our teens had several opportunities to participate in one of these fun events.

This summer, the TNT campers were treated to a TNT Adventure to Branson, MO with Operation Lift Off. Our TNT Campers traveled in style to Branson. They enjoyed a show with the Chinese Acrobats, a day in Silver Dollar City, dinner at the Dixie Stampede, and a cruise on the Branson Belle.

Since adding this program in 2018, we have been able to fill an important gap in programming, serving campers who "grew out" of other camp programs. TNT enables these "campers" to keep connected with old friends and make new in a unique community.



Family Camp

Each Labor Day weekend, Camp Rainbow takes over Trout Lodge for Family Camp. This past summer we hosted the largest Family Camp in our history with 200 campers and volunteers. Families are given the opportunity to participate in arts & crafts, archery, zip lining, boating, and so much more.
